WHEREAS, as a resident of Redwood City Louis held membership at many local organizations such as the Native Daughters of the Golden West, the Red Hat Society, and she even taught ceramics to adults and children at The Red Morton Community Center in the 60's and 70's; and

WHEREAS, Louise retired from Ampex Corporation in Redwood City, working as an engineer, where she met and worked with the founder, Alexander M. Poniatoff, Mr. Charles Black, (Shirley Temple's husband) and Bing Crosby; and

WHEREAS, she also worked for Sharon Heights Convalescent Hospital in Menlo Park, and when people would ask what she does there, she would reply, "I take care of old people" – She resigned at the age of 88; and

WHEREAS, at the age of 105 she is starting a coffee and tea company called Auntie Lou's Brew; and

WHEREAS, she has always been passionate about development in Redwood City and would often ask, "How do we please you people? I love my Redwood City!"
