WHEREAS, the City of Redwood City will join the County of San Mateo, Sequoia Hospital, and Kaiser Permanente in honoring health care workers and other essential workers on the second anniversary of the WHO's declaration by lighting the tent over Courthouse Square in blue lights on the evening of Friday, March 11; and
