Separately and independently, even if the activity constituted a project under CEQA, it would be exempt as set forth in CEQA Guidelines Section 15304, because the use of existing streets, sidewalks and private property for outdoor business activity constitutes a minor temporary use of land having negligible or no permanent effects on the environment.
