

## RESOLUTION NO.16053

### **A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDWOOD CITY SUPPORTING BICYCLE PARKING GUIDELINES, TRANSPORTATION MANAGEMENT ASSOCIATION (TMA) FEASIBILITY STUDY, AND “ESSENTIAL WHEELS” E-BIKE LOANER PROGRAM AND AUTHORIZING THE SUBMITTAL OF THREE GRANT APPLICATIONS FOR MEASURE A ALTERNATIVE CONGESTION RELIEF AND MEASURE W TRANSPORTATION DEMAND MANAGEMENT PROGRAM FUNDING**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Redwood City (City) is applying to the San Mateo County Transportation Authority (TA) for \$372,000 in Measure A Alternative Congestion Relief and Measure W Transportation Demand Management Program funds for Bicycle Parking Guidelines, Transportation Management Association (TMA) Feasibility Study, and “Essential Wheels” E-bike Loaner Program (Projects); and

**WHEREAS**, City has identified the need to implement effective Transportation Demand Management (TDM) measures in Redwood City; and

**WHEREAS**, City has developed a TDM plan in 2018 to achieve the goal of reducing vehicle trips by:

- Partnering with private developers and communities to reduce the drive-alone mode share.
- Prioritizing non-driving modes at new developments.
- Increasing the accessibility and convenience of alternatives to driving-alone options for Redwood City residents, employees, and visitors.
- Increasing awareness of all transportation choices and costs.
- Providing high-quality and financially sustainable TDM services to Redwood City residents, employees, visitors, and businesses.
- Monitoring and reporting on progress in support of the Citywide Transportation Plan.
- Encouraging use of innovative programs and new technologies to reduce driving-alone; and

**WHEREAS**, TA issued a Call for Projects for the Measure A Alternative Congestion Relief and Measure W Transportation Demand Management (ACR/TDM) Program on April 7, 2022; and

**WHEREAS**, City identified three Projects that are eligible and appropriate for the TA's ACR/TDM program funding; and

**WHEREAS**, it will cost \$403,500 to implement the Projects' scope; and

**WHEREAS**, City seeks \$372,000 in total in ACR/TDM Program funds for the Projects; and

**WHEREAS**, the TA requires a resolution from City's governing body:

1. Supporting the Projects and application for \$372,000 in total in TA ACR/TDM Program funds for Projects; and
2. Committing City to the completion of the Projects, including the commitment of matching funds in the amount of \$31,500 needed for implementation; and
3. Certifying that any funds awarded by the TA will be used to supplement existing funds for program activities, and will not replace existing funds or resources; and
4. Authorizing the City Manager to sign a funding agreement with the TA, if funds are awarded, for ACR/TDM Program funding for the Projects and to take any other actions necessary to give effect to this resolution; and
5. Committing to commence work on the Projects, if awarded, within one year of the TA Board of Directors allocating 2022 ACR/TDM Program funding.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDWOOD CITY AS FOLLOWS:**

1. Supports grant applications for TA's ACR/TDM Program funds for \$372,000 for:
  - Bicycle Parking Guidelines
  - Transportation Management Association (TMA) Feasibility Study
  - Essential Wheels E-Bike Loaner Program (in collaboration with Manzanita Works).
2. Authorizes the City Manager to execute a funding agreement with the TA to encumber any ACR/TDM Program funds awarded.

3. Commits to the completion of the Projects, including the commitment of \$31,500 of total matching funds needed for implementation of the Projects, if awarded the requested TA funds.

4. Certifies that any funds awarded by the TA will be used to supplement existing funds for the Projects and will not replace existing funds or resources.

5. Commits to commencing work on the Projects, if awarded, within one year of the TA Board of Directors allocating the 2022 ACR/TDM Program funds.

6. Authorizes the City Manager to take any other actions necessary to give effect to this resolution.
