

RESOLUTION NO 16111

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDWOOD CITY 1) ACCEPTING FY 2021 FEMA'S STAFFING FOR ADEQUATE FIRE AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE (SAFER) GRANT AWARD IN THE AMOUNT OF \$3,630,606.54 AND AUTHORIZE THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE ANY RELATED ACCEPTANCE DOCUMENTS, SUBSEQUENT AMENDMENTS OR MODIFICATIONS, AND OTHER DOCUMENTS; AND 2) APPROVE AN APPROPRIATION AMENDMENT TO INCREASE THE FY2022-23 GENERAL FUND REVENUE AND GENERAL FUND PERSONNEL EXPENDITURES BY \$1,174,611.48 TO ACCOMMODATE THE FEMA STAFFING FOR ADEQUATE FIRE AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE (SAFER) GRANT AWARD.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the City Council's grant management directives and the increased call volume, response times and overtime expenditures, staff has been aggressively pursuing grant funding from FEMA to assist in accomplishing the City's goals of reimagining services; and

WHEREAS, on September 28, 2022, the Redwood City Fire Department was awarded the FY 2021 FEMA Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grant Program in the amount of \$3,630,606.54; and

WHEREAS, the SAFER grant allows the City to hire an additional six firefighters and retain them for the next three years; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to accept the grant, authorize the City Manager to execute any related acceptance documents, subsequent amendments or modifications, and other documents, and transfer funding in order to facilitate the Project; and

WHEREAS, an appropriation amendment to the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Budget is required for implementation of the FY 2021 FEMA's Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grant; and

WHEREAS, appropriations for the remainder of the grant revenues and expenditures will be included in the development of the Adopted Budget in Fiscal Year 2023-2024 and Fiscal Year 2024-2025.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDWOOD CITY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Council hereby accepts the FY 2021 FEMA Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grant Award in the amount of \$3,630,606.54; and authorizes the City Manager to execute any related acceptance documents, subsequent amendments or modifications, and other documents, and transfer funding in order to facilitate the Project.

Section 2. The general fund revenue budget shall be increased by \$1,174,611.48 to accommodate the FEMA Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grant Award.

Section 3. The general fund expenditure budget shall be increased by \$1,174,611.48 to accommodate the FEMA Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grant Award.

Section 4. This resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption.
