Redwood City Public Comment ,

Dear Redwood City Council:

We write to inform you that our union – Bay Area Legal Aid Workers, UAW Local 2320 (BALAW) – has called for an immediate, permanent ceasefire, and we ask that you pass a ceasefire resolution of your own.

We are residents, constituents, community members, and workers that serve the Bay Area's, including Redwood City's, most vulnerable communities: low-income and working-class people, seniors, people with disabilities, non-English speakers, those without homes, and others who have faced various forms of systemic adversity.

On December 1, 2023, United Auto Workers International (UAW), our international union, called for a ceasefire in Israel and Palestine and announced that the International Executive Board would be forming a Divestment and Just Transition working group to study the history of Israel and Palestine, our union's economic ties to the conflict, and explore how we can have a just transition for US workers from war to peace.

On December 25, 2023, our bargaining unit – Bay Area Legal Aid Workers (BALAW) – passed a resolution calling for an immediate ceasefire in Gaza, an end to the occupation, and endorsed the Boycott, Divestment, Sanctions movement.

Many in our community are experiencing tremendous grief and fear as we witness unspeakable violence in Palestine and Israel and a rise in antisemitism and Islamophobia in the United States. Our resolution was aimed at bringing our union together in alignment with the values that have called each of us to legal aid work and that are articulated in our BALAW bylaws.

We stand in solidarity with the Palestine Trade Unions and endorse their demands. And we stand with dozens of other labor unions in endorsing the Labor Movement Call for Ceasefire.

We urge you to pass a resolution calling for a sustained ceasefire in Gaza; an end to US aid to Israel; the provision of sufficient humanitarian aid; the release of hostages and political prisoners; and the condemning of antisemitic, anti-Palestinian, and Islamophobic rhetoric and attacks. Critically, such a resolution also would urge the Biden Administration and Congress to call for a ceasefire. We must do all we can to end the human suffering taking place each day.

Above all, we hope to convey our sense of urgency and to emphasize the power of our voices when we speak together as one. Our bargaining unit is part of a labor movement that crosses

borders and descends from a lineage of activism for civil and human rights and against racism and Apartheid.

You represent thousands of voices, and as the number of cities joining this movement grows, the effort to prevent human loss and suffering will gain momentum. This historic moment calls on us to raise our collective voice for peace and stand in solidarity with the Palestinian people.

With that, we call for your support of a resolution calling for a permanent ceasefire in Gaza.

As a disclaimer, although I am a member of the Police Advisory Committee, I am making this comment solely as an individual resident, not speaking for the Committee.

With regard to the "growing demand for accountability" for police mentioned in the staff report, I'd ask you to consider that accountability is a normal and necessary part of all public service, and that anyone who can be deterred from working as a police officer by the prospect of needing to be accountable for their actions is very likely not someone we want in that role in any case. So I wouldn't look at that as any cause for concern in recruiting.

More importantly, the overall shift away from people wanting to work in law enforcement is a prime opportunity to take another look at the types of work that have landed with the police department over the years and consider which ones can be performed by other kinds of staff. For instance, mental health crisis response, response to homelessness, and traffic enforcement are all areas where services can effectively be provided by unarmed staff. This can help reduce the workload for armed police officers as well as recruiting expenses like those in the contract in this item. It also helps build a workforce that's more stable and better positioned to meet the community's needs in the future. So I ask you to look at this bigger picture when considering how to spend on public safety services.

For the last few months, the citizens of Redwood City have been hit with numerous rate increases, water, now waste collection services, and the proposal to have one of two tax increases.

Item 8B Now Chief Bell is in line for a pay raise when the salary is already at or above 250K. Assistant City Manager Flaherty is also in line for a pay raise again when the salary is already at over 260K. One of the reasons for the pay raises is because of some nonsense about equity pay whereas the pay of these department heads have to be paid 10% more than their subordinates.

Dear City Council,

Please do NOT approve salary range increases.

Why? Because you don't have the money to do it.

You are projecting multi-year deficits.

You are increasing water, sewer, garbage rates, fees and exploring taxes when we already pay among the highest tax rates in the state and county.

On Nextdoor, many residents were expressing concern about this. One council member said "it's complicated".

I disagree.

It is NOT complicated.

No one (including the city) should spend money they don't have. Period.

Wage compaction is the stated reason for the needed increases.

Sorry, but wage compaction is not a crisis as serious as overspending and/or overtaxing.

There are plenty of alternatives to address wage compaction:

1) Live with it (perhaps with a fiscal emergency resolution authorizing an exception).

Or

2) Lower salaries to achieve required salary differentials

I would argue the proposed salary ranges are too high even if we didn't have fiscal challenges.

For example, the proposed salary range for the police chief goes up to \$28,405 per month. That is \$341k per year base salary not including the generous benefits and retirement. You are asking working people for more taxes to fund this.

Please do the responsible thing during a fiscal crisis and, if you won't cut expenses anywhere, at least stop spending more.
